
ABOUT the COUNSELORS

Olivia Germaine danced beautifully and always has a ton of fun, she also showed how fast she was on our gym run!


William Anderson puts in 110% of effort with each activity we do, he was especially finantsic during Drama, that is very true!



the younger grades, (Pre-K, K and 1st).

We'll be revisiting many of the favorite activities from last summer, as
well as introducing some new things this summer. The first week has
gotten off to a fabulous start, and I'm looking forward to the rest of
camp!

Greetings Parents and Campers,

My name is Jonathon Bell and welcome to the Sharon Community Education's Summer 2016 STAR Camp. I am honored to be a part of this year's team with all the great things this program has to offer.

I bring 8 plus years experience working with students of this age range in both academics and athletics. Besides my tenure as an Instructional Aide, I have also coached ice hockey and baseball at the youth, high school, and junior levels. Originally I am from Vermont but have called Massachusetts home for the last 10 years.

My role over the summer will be working the Physical Education program located in the gym at Heights Elementary School. I have designed a creative program that will adhere to all age groups and learning styles that will emphasize the following 3 things:

- Athletics. Each day, the gym block will include a group stretch, followed by specific fitness exercises like jumping jacks, sit-ups, jogging, etc; before finishing with a group type activity (soccer, kickball, basketball, handball or volleyball.)

- Teamwork. Each gym session will include and encourage camper leaders to lead in stretches and activity demonstrations to enhance the cooperative learning approach and help all students incorporate a fitness for life mindset.
