
In drama we had a rousing game of Kings and Queens, Castles and Moats (a take-off on people, shelters and storms!) Drama has been a group favorite activity,

getting to know your children!





# Blazers (Grade 4)



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



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

On Friday the campers went on computer scavenger hunts. The younger campers had to find different stamps in the Kid Pix program. The older campers went on a mystery hunt for different articles at


<u>http://www.booksandgames.com/freegames/the-family-hitchcock-mystery-hunt</u>. They all had a great time.

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We've amped up the Improv in this fifth week of camp! After the 'PSA', they were introduced to this fun improvigame, that many who were here last year had been requesting since the beginning of camp this year! 
In week 4 at Star Camp we worked as entire groups, with two separate competitions that have the campers together.
